#### I. Natural Resource Management (NRM) Projects:

I. Watershed Development: NCT is implementing Watershed Development Projects with support of NABARD

since 2008. NCT has successfully completed Gondi-Mohagaon watershed in Katol tehsil of Nagpur under Indo-German Watershed Development project, supported by NABARD. A total area of 971.64 hectors have been fully treated with different structures/ measures with "Ridge-to-Valley" concept. This work was appreciated by the funding agency NABARD, other Government agencies, Resource NGO WOTR and others. Many dignitaries including RBI senior officials, NABARD officials, and senior Government officials have visited this watershed. Looking in to NCT's dedicated work on watershed, NABARD has sanctioned 4 Watershed Development Projects in Madhya

Pradesh & Chhattisgarh. Presently implementations of these four watersheds are progressing in different stages.

NABARD's Madhya Pradesh Regional Office has sanctioned 2 watersheds being implemented in Srijhot-Boudiayapani&Ghatlinga-Gudichattri villages of tribal dominated Tamia block of Chhindwara district. The Capacity Building Phase (CBP) had been successfully completed by both the watershed communities. NABARD has sanctioned the Full Implementation Phase (FIP) during July 2015. The sanction details are as under:

During this year, both the Village watershed Committees have successfully implementing the projects, by

covering planned and targeted area. By the end of the year, the community has completed over 60% of the project work, scheduling to complete the project as per sanction, by the end of March 2019. Various structures /measures i.e, Staggered Contour Trenches (CST), Water Absorption Trenches (WAT), Stone Bunding (SB), Farm Bundings (FB), Stone Outlets (SO), Farm Ponds (FP), Loose Boulder Structures (LBS), Gully Plugs (GP), Gabions, etc.Different Demonstration plots like SRI, Intercropping, Grass Fodder plots are developed. Various capacities building initiatives such as Trainings, exposures, health and sanitation, SHG capacity buildings etc were successfully completed

during the year. As per the sanction, support to landless families have also been successfully undertaken in order to enhance their overall income and living standard.

NABARD's Chhattisgarh Regional Office has sanctioned 2 watersheds being implemented in Khoba (JalgrahanVikasSamitiKhoba) & Jaitgundra (JalgrahanVikasSamitiJaitgundra) villages of tribal dominated Chhuriya block of Rajnadgaon district. The Capacity Building Phase (CBP) had been successfully completed by both the watershed communities. NABARD has sanctioned the Full Implementation Phase (FIP) during May 2016. The sanction details are as under:

During this year, both the Village watershed Committees have successfully implementing the projects, by covering planned and targeted area. By the end of the year, the community has completed over 25% of the

project work, scheduling to complete the project as per sanction, by the end of March 2019. Various structures /measures i.e., Paddy Bunding, Repair of Paddy Bunding, Pipe Outlets, Farm Ponds, Water Absorption Trench (CCT), Continue Contour Trench (CCT), Plantation, Demonstration, Capacity building, landless, etc. Different Demonstration plots like SRI, Inter-cropping, Grass Fodder plots are developed. Various capacity building initiatives such as Trainings, exposures, Bee Keeping, composting techniques, etc. were successfully completed during the year. As per the sanction, support to landless families have also been successfully undertaken in order to enhance their overall income and living standard. Both the Watershed Development

Committees have registered under society registration act of Chhattisgarh.

2. Soil Conservation Initiatives under Wadi Project: The soil conservation work i.e. Staggered Contour Trench has

been completed in different 16 wadi projects of trust. Trust has completed 100% trenches as per prescribed dimensions size of 8ft X 8 ft x 8 ft, in all wadi projects and this has built the faith and attachment towards the maintaining wadi by the farmer beneficiary and a highly positive effect on survival of horticulture plants under wadi project. This soil conservation activity has also helped to improve and increased soil moisture by which the beneficiaries went for Rabi intercropping, which fetches additional income to the family. NCT propagates digging of trenches first and then the pit because farmers can keep the top soil of the trench separately and use the same for filling the pit and use the bad or stony soil as bunds for the trenches.

This has helped the Trust to maintain (1) High survival rate (2) involvement of the beneficiary and (3) excellent health of horticulture crops in wadi projects.



3. Honey Project under UPNRM: NCT is supported about 400 traditional tribal honey collectors through systematic training, collection, processing and marketing of wild honey collected from tribal areas of Yavatmal,

Wardha, Chandrapur, Garchiroli, Amravati and Nagpur districts. The honey is sold under the brand name "VANAMRUT". NCT is implementing this innovative project since 2008. NABARD supported this project with a loan support of Rs. 15.15 Lakhs under its Umbrella Programme for Natural Resource Management (UPNRM) during 2008, which NCT has fully repaid during the year financial year 2012-13. During the year on behalf of the honey collector's association, NCT has marketed processed honey worth Rs. 20.80Lacs. Under the Mango Tree (UTMT), a social organisation form Mumbai has emerged as one of the major bulk buyers for honey collected by tribal beneficiaries from Vidharba region.

During this year, ACUMEN (A non-profit global venture capital fund) of New York (USA) with support of UTMT & NCT has conducted the Impact Assessment Study of tribal honey collector in Yavtmal district of Maharashtra. The key objective of ACUMEN's study was to assess the change in living standard of tribal honey collector due to honey activities. NCT has provided all field level support to ACCUMEN and UTMT for completion of this study.

#### **II.** Livelihood Projects:

I. Integrated Tribal Development Programme (Wadi Project) under Tribal Development Fund: Wadi project / Programme is one of the most popular developmental programmes of NABARD. Under Wadi or TDF programme / project, tribal families are supported for developing one acre orchard in waste / dry land owned by them. Along with support for horticulture, the families are also supported for soil conservation, water resource development, development of improved and sustainable agriculture, support to landless families, health, women development, training and capacity building etc. In other words, this is a developmental programme with a holistic approach.

Since inception, 16 Wadi projects are being implemented by the Trust in three state of central

India i.e. Maharashtra (7), Madhya Pradesh (5) and Chhattisgarh (4). Out of 16 projects, one TDF project TDF-Tamia (Old) has been completed in March 2016, two projects that of Nagpur and Amravati-I has been completed in March 2017 and Five TDF project that of Amravati Additional, Kurkheda, Chhuriya-I, Tamia El and TDF-Bhainsdehi have been completed in March-2018.

NCT has implemented various innovative initiatives within the NABARD supported Tribal Development Programme for successful implementation of the programme. It is observed from the experience of the Trust that there are 5 major activities / factors which have positive impact on success of Wadi programme as follows:

(1) Proper Trench and Pit making: Technically, proper pit is required for overall growth of any horticulture plant. NCT made it a point that all farmers make proper pits of size 41"x 41"x 41", which is just over the standard size of IM x IM. NCT also propagates and ensures even size for any horticulture variety such as Mango, Guava, Lime, Awla or for Custard apple. This is to make sure that the farmers will not neglect the 2nd horticulture crop. Normally, it is observed that Tribal farmers take good care of Mango and give step-motherly treatment to the 2nd or 3rd horticulture crop, in spite of the fact that they are also equally important for him in fetching better and continuous income throughout the year.

It is also technically proven that proper contour trenches have a highly positive effect on survival of horticulture

plants. Also due to improved and increased soil moisture, the beneficiaries can easily go for Rabi intercropping, which fetches additional income to the family. NCT propagates digging of trenches first and then the pit because farmers can keep the top soil of the trench separately and use the same for filling the pit and use the bad or stony soil as bunds for the trenches. NCT ensures that 60 trenches of size 8'x 2' x 2' be made just 6 feet above the pit. These 60 trenches have the capacity to conserve over 8 Lac liters of water during the 3 months rainy season. Due to this huge conservation of water in one acre of land, the moisture content of the soil is maintained up to Feb-March.

Very interestingly, it is observed that, any beneficiary who has completed 100% trench and pit as per prescribed dimensions has taken care of his Wadi properly. At the same time, the farmers who have not completed the trenches and pits have neglected the wadis and some of them have migrated, in spite of strong efforts by the project implementation team. It clearly shows that 100% trench and pit making is a "once in a life time" activity and very tough to achieve. Once it is done properly, the farmers normally take care of their Wadis as they do not want their efforts to go waste. Hence, NCT ensures that all farmers dig the trenches of 8ft X 8ft x 8 ft and pit of

size 41'x 41'x 41'. This has helped the Trust to maintain (1) High survival rate (2) involvement of the beneficiary and (3) excellent health of horticulture crops.

(2) Proper fencing for protection of Wadis: proper fencing is required to protect the Wadis from stray animals. Since inception, NCT is successfully convincing the farmers to convert the amount available as labour charges into purchase of barbed wire for fencing. Even farmers are willing to put in a little money as the amount available as labour

charges is not sufficient. Barbed wire fencing has not only helped in

protection of the Wadis, but also has helped in building the much required confidence amongst the farmers to take up the Wadi maintenance as in Horticulture crops the benefit is seen only after 4-5 years.

(3) Use of Amrutjal and Gomutra+Milk spray: This is a very simple organic treatment, which costs the farmers

NCT has inculcated the habit of application of Amrutpani (cow dung and cow urine is mixed and with the help of little jaggery, the mixture is fermented for 4 days to increase micro organisms) once in every 5 days. It is observed that, the growth and health of plants where farmers regularly use Amrutpani is excellent and even in summer, these wadis have survived with very less water. Regular spray of Cow Urine and Fresh cow milk (50ml each in 15 lit of water) has helped in proper growth and health of plants. Spraying Cow urine keeps pests and disease away and spraying cow milk increases photosynthesis. These two simple, organic, no cost treatments have helped in better survival and good
- (4) Proper use of FYM, micronutrients and organic growth agents: Over a period of time and through experience, it is learnt that use of Farm-Yard-Manures, micronutrients and organic growth agents have helped in proper growth and good survival of Wadi plantation. Hence, proper care is taken in minimum 2 times application of FYM, use of micronutrients both in the form of soil application as well as spray application; use of organic growth agents is being adopted for better growth of Wadi plants.
- (5) Community mobilization and empowerment of Village Planning Committees: Community mobilization or involvement of community in project implementation is the key to the success of any project. Keeping this in mind, as per NABARD guidelines, NCT has promoted Village Planning Committees (VPCs) in all project villages of all TDF projects. Combining all VPCs, a Project Planning Committee (PPC) has also been formed. Proper training has been given to the members of both, VPC and PPC. Later, NCT converted these PPCs into producers' organizations (POs) in 12 projects.

Other Innovative activities under TDF projects: Various innovative initiatives have been supported by the Trust under all the TDF projects being implemented. Some of them are as under;

Adoption of SRI method in rice cultivation: NCT has created substantial awareness in this regard in the wadi beneficiary farmers, mainly in Rajnandgaon in Chhattisgarh state and Gadchiroli&Gondia districts of Maharashtra state, both of which are sensitive districts. In above all three districts, rice is the major crop. NCT has been making efforts to encourage farmers in all project area to adopt SRI method of rice cultivation since 2011. Over 3200 farmers from three blocks i.e. Chhuriya block of Rajnadgaon and Korchi&kurkheda blocks of Gadchiroli

district are practising of SRI in their farms. Now this year, NCT has supported farmers adopt the SRI method for rice cultivation and increase the yield in different TDF project area. This intervention has raised the confidence of farmers as they have, on an average gained about Rs. 10-15 thousand extra per acre of rice cultivation.

- 2) Implementation of TDF Projects through bank transfer of funds to Village planning committee accounts: To increase transparency in project implementation, NABARD as well as Government of India, insists upon direct transfer of funds to the bank account of beneficiaries. Taking the initiative forward, the Trust transfers major portion of grant amount sanctioned by NABARD into the bank account of respective Village Planning Committee (VPC) accounts. The major activities covered are that of Water Resource Development (WRD), landless support, labour payments, purchase of small inputs etc. This has helped in maintaining transparency in project implementation. This process has also enhanced the involvement of the beneficiaries and committee members in project implementation. The Trust has evolved an innovative system for approving the activity and proper monitoring and documentation, after transfer of funds in to VPC's account. The major purchases such as planting materials, inputs, pump-sets, drums, barbed-wire for fencing etc is purchased with quotation system, involving project implementation team and project beneficiaries.
- India. Through these 16 projects, NCT has been able to establish 19314 wadies across the all projects with support of NABARD. Since last two years, NABCONS (Subsidiary of NABARD) is conducting regular monitoring of all TDF projects, which are being implemented by the Trust. The survival of all trust's project found between 75-90%. During the evaluation, trust have gained learning from the different evaluator/enumerator & different senior staffs of NABCONS, which have used in new project i.e. TDF-Korchi Expansion. During the evaluation, it was suggested to plough he wadi so that beneficiary could attract and get regular income from intercropping. This suggestion was implemented by the trust in third year plantation of TDF-Korchi Expansion project and getting good result.
- 4) Successful Completion of Five TDF Projects: At the end of 2017-18, five TDF projects i.e. TDF-Chhuriya, Amravati Addl., Kurkheda, Tamia El and TDF-Betul have been successfully completed. All the completed five TDF projects have been completed their tenure with the wadi survival of above 70%. The Project Completion reports have been submitted to NABARD for further impact evaluation of project.

#### **III.** Women Development:

I. Promotion of Self-Help Groups: NCT is implementing an ambitious 5000 SHG-Bank linkage program for

NABARD. During the year various types of trainings have been imparted for all these SHGs. Apart from this, NCT is also implementing two SHG promotion and credit linkage programmes at (1) Women-SHG programme at LWE affected Seoni district and (2) Betul districts of Madhya Pradesh. As the bankers were little reluctant to finance SHGs and due to demand from SHGs, NCT has started providing small loans to these SHGs from its Micro Finance portfolio. This has helped the SHGs in generation of additional income, motivated them to continue the SHG concept and also motivated other non-SHG members in the villages to form new SHGs for their overall development. Hence, the Trust has decided to

support these new SHGs wherever it is possible and link them to the local banks whenever they are ready to do so.



Apart from these on-going programmes, The Trust has promoted over 10000 SHGs in 4 districts of Maharashtra and 3 districts of Madhya Pradesh. These SHGs have been formed since 2001. NCT

has promoted federations of these SHGs to provide sustainability and supported their Community Managed Resource Centres (CMRCs). The Trust is providing handholding to all SHGs promoted during last 10 years.

2. E-Shakti: E-Shakti or Digitisation of SHGs is an initiative of Micro Credit and Innovations Department of NABARD. It is a project under which, the social and financial data of the Self Help Groups and their members in

the selected districts are digitized. Digitisation brings all the SHGs on to the technology platform and into the fold of Financial Inclusion, thereby helping them access wider range of financial services. This helps bankers in client appraisal and credit dispensation.NCT, proudly took part in NABARD's this prestigious initiative, step for digitization of SHGs i.e. "E-Shakti". E-Shakti, that gives new definition to SHG movement is an opportunity for all the stakeholders like- SHG itself, its members, Bankers, PIAs, Resource agencies and Finally NABARD. The mobile App enabled bilingual (English and Hindi) system is easy to handle that with a little training a villager or a SHG women can operate it.

Even a loan application can easily be generated through the app and will directly go to the concerned bank. The system itself grade the SHG and generate balance sheet and give glimpses of every detail (Panch Sutra) about that particular SHG and hence saves the time of a banker.NCT has digitized 1700 SHGs in Chhindwara district of Madhya Pradesh and 400 SHGs in Nagpur district of Maharashtra state. All the SHGs are women SHGs with an average strength of 12 women a group.

#### IV. Farmer's Welfare Projects:

I. Promoting Farmers Producer Organizations (FPOs): It is a fact that farmers especially small & marginal farmers who are the backbone of the Indian Economy have always felt neglected. Farmers put in a lot of hard work to make the two ends meet. They have to face a lot of hardship for their survival. Right price for their produce, role

of middle-man, easy availability of inputs, unavailability of technology for enhancement of production are the common questions raised when it comes to our farmers' welfare. The country's focus is on improving farmers' socio-economic status through collectivize and provide legal entity to the farmers in the form of Farmer Producer Organization/Company under The Companies Act 2013 through which they would be able to get Agri-inputs at minimum costs and sell their produce at maximum prize. This will also help the farmers' especially small & marginal farmers in the country in enhancing production,

productivity, technology adoption and profitability of agriculturists,

minimizing the role of middle-men. NABARD has sanctioned 12 FPOs for three years in 3 states of central India. NCT with support from NABARD has been able to formed/registered these 12 Farmers Producer Organizations under companies act-2013, in 7 district of 3 states i.e. Maharashtra (5), Madhya Pradesh (5) and Chhattisgarh (2). The efforts are being done to strengthen these FPOs through facilitation support for training, exposures, FPO office establishment, business plan preparation, market linkages, credit linkages and fulfil the legal compliances. These FPOs have started the business activities from last one year like providing agri-input like seeds, fertilizers to the member farmers and marketing support to farm produce like maize, pulses, paddy, mango, etc. Out of 12, two FPOs are working independently since last year and 10 FPOs are getting support from the NCT to further strengthening. The detail of these 10 FPOs and their location are below:-

#### V. Health & Sanitation Programmes:

I. AarogyalaYojana (Loan based Rural Sanitation Programme):

NCT is implementing this loan based rural sanitation programme, known as 'AarogyalayYojana' supported by NABARD since 2008. NCT has supported over 10000 SHG members from Nagpur, Wardha and Amravati districts of Maharashtra and Chhindwara and Seoni districts of Madhya Pradesh. Over a period of last 7 years, this has emerged as a successful model for providing sanitation facilities in rural villages. This has been one of the most successful programmes for the Trust because (I) the Trust provides easy loans to the SHG members and also provides technical support in construction of toilets. All SHG members who have taken loan have utilised the amount for the purpose, constructed toilet units and have started using the same. (2) The availability of

a toilet has reduced the drudgery of rural women, has helped them in improving their health and

hygiene standards and save money on various diseases. (3) The women SHG members are repaying the loans promptly, which has helped the Trust to repay the principal amount and service the interest to NABARD. Offlate, during the year, due to political issues, repayment of SHG loans has taken a beating. The position of loan, its repayment and number of units supported up to 31/03/2018 is as under;

- 2. Habitat for Humanity India (HfHI): During the Year, Mahindra Foundation & Habitat for Humanity India (HfHI) has sanctioned grant support to NCT for the construction of 175 toilet units in rural areas of Deoli blocks of Wardha district. Under this initiative, Mahindra Foundation &HfHI would be supporting Rs.20,000/- for construction of toilet unit to the needy beneficiary. NCT is implementing this work with the active involvement of beneficiary.
- 3. Introduced Smokeless Chulla: As per NABARD's sanction of TDF projects, NCT supports each tribal family with a smokeless chulha (stove), which helps the women members of the family to overcome drudgery. Normally, a low cost chulha is made of cement, grit and sand. These cook-stoves save ¾ of fire wood and at the same time provide clean energy. The food cooked using this stove is much cleaner and tastier. NCT introduced this type of cook-stoves in NABARD supported all TDF projects and installed around. This year total 570 smokeless chulhas have been installed in TDF project areas.
- 4. Jaldoot Campaign: In the year 2017, on the occasion of World Water Day (22nd March, 2017) NABARD launched a major Water Campaign with a theme: "JalJeevanHai" to cover around 1,00,000 villages in
  - vulnerable/water stressed areas where the ground water is over exploited. Chhindwara was one among the 200 districts that had been identified for the purpose. Nageshwara Charitable Trust covered 270 such villages in the district to address water conservation related issues. The process that we opted was Participatory Rural Appraisal(PRA) method in which firstly the villagers' mapped the village and its natural resources on a drawing sheet and then marked the water related issues and finally solutions to their problems. Outcomes of the process were water plans was prepared by the villagers and submitted to the concern Gram Panchayat. As a result villagers in 25 villages took part

in "shramdan" to clean their water resources like Hand Pump, Well and Nallahs, etc.

B. Agriculture Knowledge Centre (AKC) Or KrishiGyan Kendra: NCT is involved in welfare of farmers and crop yield augmentation initiatives since 2005. It was a continuous endeavour of the Trust to support the

farmers in adoption of new technologies / methods, while maintaining / continuing the traditional farming methods. NCT felt the need of demonstration and training of farmers for both new technology adoption and traditional methods. NCT's Trustees with their vast experience of implementing various agriculture projects have developed an Integrated Agriculture Farm & Agriculture Knowledge Centre which is situated at Raulgaon village of Katol Block of Nagpur, Maharashtra, about 30 Kms from Nagpur city on Nagpur-Katol road. This Farm could provide unique opportunities for the farmers/students to learn the innovative agriculture practices like use of drip and sprinklers, protected farming using green

houses and shade-net houses, preparation of organic manures, dairy management, Azola cultivation, Integrated Pest Management, proper nutrient and micronutrient management, use of solar energy, water conservation, rain water harvesting and many more agriculture technologies. NCT has also constructed an Agriculture Knowledge Centre (AKC) at this place, where farmers can stay for day or two and learn various farming methods. The AKC was inaugurated by Dr. Harsh Kumar Bhanwala, Hon. Chairman of NABARD on 24/02/2015. He praised the efforts made by NCT in establishing the centre and several activities in one centre. In 2017-18 year, around 300 students of CDS School, Nagpur and 500 farmers from different locations of Central India have visited to the AKC and got exposure on different modern & tradition agriculture practises.

### Following activities / initiatives are available for the farmers to see, learn and replicate:

- Vegetable cultivation using drip irrigation & precision farming methods. 1)
- 2) Multi-Cropping methods.
- 3) Water conservation and rain water harvesting.
- 4) Automated water management system using Drip-Automation.
- 5) Vegetable cultivation and floriculture under hitech Poly houses and Shade-net houses, use of sprinklers and foggers to maintain required humidity and temperature to create conducive atmosphere for vegetable cultivation & floriculture.
- Improved dairy activities with proper cow shed, mechanised milking machine, Hydrolic Fodder Machine, use of chop-cutter, collection and use of cow-urine through drip system, Packaging of Milk, etc.

# VI. Other Projects Supported by Central and State Government Departments, Banks and other agencies:

I. SHG Financing Programme by Bank of Maharashtra (BOM): NABARD is promoting Self Help Groups (SHGs)

since 25 years and over 80 lacs SHGs have been formed in all over India. The major objective of formation & promotion of SHGs was to make available the finance/loan to the SHG so that SHGs could take up the income generation activities at large for development and empowerment of women. Even after 25 years of existence of SHG, bankers are still little reluctant to finance SHGs.

NCT has promoted over 10000 SHGs in three states of central India and out of them 4000 SHG has been formed/ promoted in Nagpur district only. These 4000 SHGs are 12-15 years old and have savings up to 2 lacs and eligible to get loan up to 5 lacs as per RBI

norms. Two years ago, Bank of Maharashtra has approached NCT and showed interest in providing loans to NCT promoted/nurtured, mature SHGs in Nagpur district through linkage support from NCT. Now Bank of Maharashtra has been providing small loans to NCT promoted SHGs for taking up income generation activities in Ramtek&Mauda block of Nagpur district. NCT is playing key role in linking these SHGs to the BOM and in collection of EMIs. The activity is doing extremely well and as on 31/03/2018, 224 SHGs of two blocks were supported with a cumulative loan disbursement of Rs. 405.61 Lacs. Each SHG has been supported with the loan of around Rs. 2 lacs. All the SHGs are repaying loan instalment regularly (100% repayment). Last year, Shri. G.R. Chintala, CGM of NABARD-Mumbai has also visited Mauda block and appreciated this joint initiate of NCT & BOM. This loan has helped SHGs members in generating additional income which has made a positive impact on their living standard. There is a great enthusiasm in all SHGs as they are getting loan easily and have been empowered.

# **SUCCESS STORIES**

#### Farmer Producer Organization (FPO) is Playing Key Role in the life of Tribal Farmers of Kurai

Since 2012-13, Integrated Tribal Development Programme (Wadi Project) is being implemented in tribal dominated Kurai block of Seoni district by the Nageshwara Charitable Trust (NCT) with financial support from National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD). The major objective is to enhance socioeconomic status of the tribal farmers/community and bring them in the mainstream of the development. The program was gaining the huge success in the tribal Kurai block. During the time, it was continuously discussing that, there should be arrangement by which farmers could sell their farm production and could easily access the agriculture inputs. In 2015-16, NABARD extended their hand to NCT for formation and promotion of Farmer Producer Organization in Kurai block. The farmer's expectation and need were getting shape due to this support of NABARD.

Since July 2015, NCT started the discussion with farmers of 17 villages of Kurai block. The baseline study was also

done on existing condition of input cost, production & marketing. The farmers were oriented on the concept of FPO and how farmers can avail the benefit from it. Rigorous discussions were taken place in all the 17 villages. Lead farmers were identified and provided them exposure to successful running FPOs at different locations within and outside the state of Madhya Pradesh. Then 10 directors were identified democratically by the farmers of 17 villages and get them registered in ROC. On 26/04/2016 the group of farmers with 10 directors received the registration with name of "Vainganga Agro Farmers Producer Company Limited (VAFPCL)" under the Companies Act-2013. The registration no. of FPO is U01100MP2016PTC040628. The



objective of the farmer's producer company is to provide timely agri-input on reasonable rate and to provide better market price to the farm produce of member farmers. Presently there are 310 member farmers with the share capital of Rs. 3.60 lakh. This FPO is purely of small of marginalized farmers.

Business of Padyy Reaper Machine (Custom Hiring):- Since inception, Vainganga Agro Farmers Producer Company Limited (ADFPCL) is making an effort to provide the benefit to the member farmers. Immediate after



the registration in 2016, the director has decided to purchase Paddy Reaper Machine as it was requirement of farmers. This business was of big merchants/people and farmers were paying big amount to them for harvesting their paddy crops. The directors had conducted their meeting and discussed the issues. This time there were 120 members with share capital of around 1.30 lakh. They decided do not take loan for this purpose and use the share capital amount. Then they purchased the Paddy Repear Machine worth Rs. 1,09,000/- in harvesting season of 2016. When they purchased the machine there was discussion among the farmers about operator of machine. Then they passed the resolution and decided one

of director will operate this machine and FPO will pay the wages to the director from the income. Now since 2016, FPO is providing Reaper Machine on rent to member farmers Rs. 350/- @ per hour which are the 100 rupees less than market rate. Till the harvesting season of winter, VAFPCL have done business of around Rs. I Lakh from Paddy Reaper Machine. By this activity, VAFPCL have able to

provide regular employment to the one director and resolved the harvesting issue of many member farmers.

2) Business of Agri-Inputs:- VAFPCL have received the all legal licenses from the Agriculture department of Madhya

Pradesh and working towards to provide quality & timely agri-input to the member farmers at reasonable rate. VAFPCL have collected all necessary document and agriculture related information of the member farmers at the time of memberships. VAFPCL have developed integrated membership form for the






members. On the basis of available data and discussion with member farmers, the demands of seeds are generated /gathered from the member farmers. In the meeting of directors, it was decided to take some advance booking amount from the farmers along with their order of seeds or any other inputs. This message was

communicated to the all member farmers and members also welcome of that. This practice is being implemented since last two years. Till now VAFPCL have done the business of seed supply of around Rs. 13.20 lakh with more than 400 farmers. The farmers have saved around Rs. 100 behind 1 bag of paddy seed. FPO has earned profit of around Rs. 1,00,000/- from this business till now. Now, VAFPCL have established their Agro Mall in the Kurai and playing role of Farmer Facilitation Center for the member farmers.

3) Aggregation and Trading of Crops (Paddy & Wheat):- Since last year-2017, VAFPCL have started the aggregation

and trading of paddy crop of member farmers. Farmer were selling crop to the middle- man in very minimum rate even loss in measuring of weight. This matter was discussed in the meeting of directors. Then the VAFPCL received the Mandi License from APMC-Seoni and started the aggregation and trading activity of paddy. FPO also established marketing linkages with some buyers like Rice Miller, NCDEX, Mandi, etc. so that the market could easily available to the farm produce. The FPO has paid the higher rate of paddy to the farmer (more Rs. 100 rupees @ per quintal than the rate of broker). This has built the more confidence towards the FPO. This year FPO has done business of Paddy Rs. 2 lakh and earned profit Rs. 7,500/-.In the



Aggregation & Marketing of NTFP (Mahua):- In the summer season, tribal farmers arrange their livelihood through collection and selling of Mahua. After the collection & dryness of Mahua, this has been selling to the small merchants in minimum rate. This issue was being discussed in the meeting of directors. The directors & CEO has decided to aggregate the collected mahua from the members and

provided them the good price. Since last two years, VAFPCL is doing this activity with the member farmers. In last two years, VAFPCL have aggregated around 5 ton mahua from the member farmers and stored it for 3-4 months and then sold it to the big merchants. Till now, FPO has done business of NTFP Rs. 1.23 lakh and earned profit aroundRs. 15,000/-.

5) Value Addition Activities:- VAFPC have helped member farmers in packaging & marketing of wadi produce i.e.

Custard Apple & Mango. Since last one year VAFPCL are purchasing Custard Apple & Mango from wadi beneficiaries/member then did grading, packaging and marketing. VAFPCL have provided good price to wadi produce and marketed it in Nagpur, Seoni & Chhindwara. VAFPCL have done marketing of Custard Apple of around Rs. 75,000/- and earn small but valuable benefit Rs. 5,000/-. Also did marketed the wadi's Kesar Mango of around Rs. 1,00,000/-and earn small but valuable benefit Rs. 7,000/-. There was huge demand of Kesar Mango of wadi as it was totally cultivated through organic process under TDF initiative of NABARD.



At the end, Vainganga Agro Farmers Producer Company Limited (ADFPCL), is the institution of small & marginalized tribal farmers and moving towards providing benefit to the farmers of Kurai block of Seoni district in Madhya Pradesh. To extend the business scale, VAFPCL applied for Working Capital Loan to NABKISAN and soon it will sanction and disbursed the FPO........

During the time, it was continuously discussing that, there should arrangement by which farmers could sell their farm production and could obtain the agriculture inputs. In 2015-16, NABARD extended their hand to NCT for formation and promotion of Farmer Producer Organization in Khoba Cluster of Chhuriya block. The farmer's expectation and

need were getting shape due to this support of NABARD.

Since September 2015, NCT started the discussion with farmers of 18 villages of khoba cluster. The baseline study was also done on existing condition of input cost, production & marketing. The farmers were oriented on the concept of FPO and how farmers can avail the benefit from it. Rigorous discussions were taken place in all the 18 villages. Lead farmers were identified and provided them exposure to successful running FPOs at different location. Then 10 directors were identified democratically by the farmers of 18 villages and get them reg ister in ROC. On 17/05/2016 the group of farmers with 10 directors received the registration with name of "Aadiwasi Dharohar Farmers Producer Company Limited" under the

Companies Act-2013. The registration no. of FPO is U01100CT2016PTC007281. The objective of the farmer's producer company is to provide timely agriinput on reasonable rate and to provide better market price to the farm produce of member farmers. Presently there are 434 member farmers with the share capital of Rs. 5.14 lakh. This FPO is purely of small of marginalized farmers.

Business of Combined Harvester (Custom Hiring):-Since inception, AadiwaiDharohar Farmers Producer Company Limited (ADFPCL) is making an effort to provide the benefit to the member farmers. Immediate after the registration in 2016, the director has decided to purchase Paddy Combined Harvester as it was requirement of farmers. This business was of big

merchants/people and farmers were paying big amount to them for harvesting their paddy crops. The directors had contacted with different finance institution like Cholamandalam, Muthoot Finance, Mahindra Finance, different Banks, and other institution but nobody was ready to provide the loan as this was the new companies and was not able to provide collateral. Then directors themselves arranged Rs. 12 lakh and invested in FPO as a director's loan. They had 2 lakh share capital that time. They had given 14 lakh to Harvester Company and purchased the combined harvester worth Rs. 17 lakh. Remaining 3 lakh they paid from the business/rent of harvester. FPO is providing harvester on rent to member farmers Rs. 1800/-@per acer which

are the 200 rupees less than market rate. Till the harvesting season of winter, ADFPCL have done business of around Rs. 7 Lakh from Combined Harvester.

Business of Agri-Inputs:- ADFPCL have received the all legal licenses from the Agriculture department of Chhattisgarh and working towards to provide quality & timely agri-input to the member farmers at reasonable

rate. ADFPCL have collected all necessary document and agriculture related information of the member farmers at the time of memberships. ADFPCL have developed integrated membership form for the members. On the basis of available data and discussion with member farmers, the demands of seeds are generated /gathered from the member farmers. In the meeting of directors, it was decided to take some advance booking amount from the farmers along with their order of seeds or any other inputs. This message was communicated to the all member farmers and members also welcome of that. This practice is being implemented since last two years. Till now ADFPCL have



done the business of seed supply of around Rs. 9 lakh with more than 500 farmers. The farmers have saved Rs. 120 behind I bag of paddy seed. FPO has earned profit of Rs. around 35,000/- from this business till now.

Then the ADFPCL received the Mandi License from APMC-Dongargaon and started the aggregation and trading activity of paddy. FPO also established marketing linkages with some buyers like Rice Miller, NCDEX, Mandi, etc. so that the market could easily available to the farm produce. The FPO has paid the higher rate of paddy to the farmer (more Rs. 150 rupees @ per quintal than the rate of broker). This has built the more confidence towards the FPO. This year FPO has done business of 5.50 lakh and earned profit Rs. 13,500/-.



4) Value Addition Activities:- ADFPC have helped member farmers in packaging & marketing of wadi produce. Since last two year ADFPCL are purchasing Mango from wadi beneficiaries/member then did grading, packaging and



marketing with the name of "ChhuriyaKesarAam". ADFPCL have provided good price to wadi produce and marketed it in Raipur & Nagpur. ADFPCL have done marketing of mango of around Rs. I lakh and earn small but valuable benefit Rs. I 0,000/-. ADFPCL also processed the rice and marketed with the name of "Jai Shree Ram Rice." ADFPCL havenot earned profit in this but have helped to the member farmers.

At the end, AadiwasiDharohar Farmers Producer Company Limited (ADFPCL), is the institution of small & marginalized tribal farmers and moving towards providing benefit to the farmers of Chhuriya block of Rajnandgaon district in Chhattisgarh. To extend the

business scale, ADFPCL is in process to established credit linkages with bank & NABKISAN......discussion have already started.

FPO Managing Wadi & Watershed inititives:- ADFPCL is an institution of tribal farmers/wadi beneficiaries of TDF-Chhuriya-I project who have successfully taken over the wadi project and making efforts to provide the benefit to these farmers even after completion of TDF-Chhuriya-I project. The momentum of wadi project has

kept alive by the directors of ADFPCL who were actively involved in the wadi programme and was part of PPC & VPCs......now they are the director and leaders of ADFPCL. These directors have identified key lead farmers/member who has joined hand with the directors making efforts to

bring maximum wadi beneficiary under the umbrella of ADFPCL and provide benefit to them. On the other hand, NCT with active support of Village Watershed Committee (VWC) is implementing two watershed projects in this cluster of ADFPCL. The members of FPO are also involved in watershed development work. They are actively participating in different project activities and representing their VWC at various platforms.

# Melghat Farmers Moves towards the Business of Mango

Nageshwara Charitable Trust (NCT) is implementing 2 Integrated Tribal Development Programme (Wadi

Project) under NABARD's Tribal Development Fund (TDF) in Melghat region of Amravati district since 2010-11. Through this wadi project, 4000 tribal families of melghat region are being supported for establishing the orchid (wadi) of horticulture crops/fruits i.e. Mango, Aawla & Guava. Along with, NCT with support of NABARD has also made efforts to collectivize small & marginal farmers under the umbrella of Farmers Producer Organization (FPO) for value addition & marketing support to farm produce. As a result, farmers of melghat have come together and formed their organization/company in March-2016 with the name of "Aadiwasi Mitra Farmers' Producer Company Limited (AMFPCL)". Since inception, AMFPCL has



been supporting their farmers to provide agriculture inputs i.e. seeds & fertilizers in reasonable price and marketing support for getting better price of their farm produce. This summer, all the established orchid/wadi has good production of Kesar Mango. AMFPCL is collecting this mango and adding value like grading, sorting, packaging and marketing, so that farmers would able to good prize of their farm produce/mango. AMFPCL has also developed the brand name for marketing of this wadi mango "Melghat Kesar Mango".

On 12/05/2017, the farmers/director of AMFPCL met with Collector of Amravati district Shri. Abhijit Bangar (IAS) along with NABARD's DDM Shri. Narayan Paunikar, and shared about different initiatives of NABARD &



NCT in Melghat region. The collector has appreciated the efforts of farmers/NABARD/NCT and showed interest to visit wadi project and FPO. The directors of AMFPCL has gave first packed mango box of Melghat Kesar Mago to the collector and then started their marketing. AMFPCL has opened their mango stall at the Paratwada Market and selling mango with the price of Rs. 80/- (A Grade), Rs. 70/- (B Grade) and Rs. 60/- (C Grade). This is the first initiative in Melghat region where farmers are the producer and traders of their produce. The response to this Mango is very good and continuously demanding for Mango.





# अंतरफराल में सब्जी उत्पादन से बदली किसान की जिंदगी

मेहनत को सही दिशा दी जाये तो कार्य सफल होता है। ऐसी ही कहानी है, एक मेहनती, जुझारू, कर्मठ किसान की जो साधनों के

अभाव में दिशाविहीन मेहनत कर रहा था। उसकी मेहनत को गित एवं दिशाप्रदान की नाबार्ड की महत्वकांक्षी जनजातिय विकास परियोजना ने। छुरिया विकासखंड के छोटे से ग्राम बजरंगपुर पोस्ट खोभा का एक किसान पृथ्वी खुरश्याम ने अपने कंधो पर बहुत छोटी उम्र मे जिम्मेदारियों का बोझ लेकर अपना एवं अपने परिवार का जीवन यापन समस्याओ से जुझकर कर रहा था। उसके परिवार मे पत्नि ललती बाई एवं दो बच्चे सुमन एवं सुनील तथा सास-ससुर भी है। उसके पास कूल 3 एकड़ खेत एवं 1 एकड़ पड़त भुमि थी जिसमे खेती करता और सीजन के बाद में मजदूरी करता था। इसी दौरान नागेश्वरा चेरिटेबल ट्रस्ट के माध्यम से उसे बाड़ी परियोजना से जोड़ा गया, जिसमे उसने अपने 1 एकड़ पड़त भूमि मे 30 आम, 20 नीबू, एवं



10 जाम के पौधे लगाये। इसके साथ-साथ अंतर्वर्ती फसल के रूप मे साग-सब्जी भी लगाई। पानी एवं घेराव की व्यवस्था संस्था के द्वारा किया गया। इसका लाभ पृथ्वी ने तत्परता से लिया। पौधो के साथ-साथ अपनी साग-सब्जी को भी पानी एवं खाद आदि देता गया। कुछ ही माह मे साग-सब्जी के पौधो में फल लग गये। वही से एक सुखद संदेश वो पृथ्वी के लिये लेकर आये। जिसने पृथ्वी के जीवन को बदल दिया। आज रोजाना पृथ्वी इन सब्जियो को बेचकर 200 से 300 रूपये रोज कमाता है। अगर आस-पास के गावो मे कही मेला, मंडई या बड़ा बाजार लगता है तो वहां साग-सब्जी बेचकर 500 रूपये तक कमा लेता है।

इस तरह पृथ्वी ने अपने जीवन को नागेश्वरा चेरिटेबल ट्रस्ट के साथ जोड़कर नाबार्ड की बाड़ी परियोजना से रूपांतरित किया है। वह एस. आर. आई. विधि से धान की खेती करके भी अब कम मेहनत, कम लागत एवं पानी के कम उपयोग करके अच्छी फसल भी लेता है।

# मांडव पध्द्तीने भाजीपाला लागवड करून उत्पन्नात वाढ

मी सदाराम महारु कोरेटी, पाउलझोला या गावातील एक आदिवासी शेतकरी माझ्याकडे 5 एकर कोरडवाहू जमीन असल्याने व फक्त 3 एकर भागातच धानाची शेती करायचो बाकीची जमीन जंगल भागातील असल्याने व पाण्याची कुठलीही व्यवस्था नसल्या कारणाने पडीक अवस्थेत होती, माझ्या कुटुंबात पाच सदस्य असून सर्वांची उपजीविका हि या शेतीवरच व मजुरी वर अवलंबून होती.





2015 साली मला नागेश्वरा चॅरीटेबल ट्रस्ट या संस्थेचे अधिकारी भेटले त्यांनी नाबार्ड वाडी परियोजना अंतर्गत माझ्या पिडक जिमनीत आंबा, जांब आणि लिम्बाचे एका एकरमध्ये झाडे लावण्यास समजावले. त्यानंतर एक एकरमध्ये मी या झाडांची लागवड केली, आणि या परियोजने अंतर्गत माझ्या पडीक जिमनीमध्ये दहा वाडी धारक शेतकरी मिळून borewell करून दिली आणि यामुळे माझ्या शेतीमध्ये पाण्याची व्यवस्था झाली आणि आता मी माझ्या वाडी मध्ये बारमाही आंतरपीक घेण्यास सुरवात केली तसेच नाबार्ड मार्फत मला भाजीपाला व वेलवर्गीय भाजीपाला मांडव पद्धतिने लागवड करण्यासाठी बिज आणि

अन्य मांडव चे सामान मिळाले त्यामुळे आता मी माझ्या शेतात मिरची, पालक, संभार, वांगे, टमाटर, चवळी, लवकी, दोडका, कारली, वालाची शेंग इत्यादी प्रकारचे उत्पादन घेऊन जवळच्या बाजार मध्ये विकून मी महिन्याचे 7000 रुपयाचे उत्पन्न कमावतो. या मुळे सध्या माझी आर्थिक परिस्थिती चांगली झाली असून आता मी मजुरी करण्याची गरज नाही राहिली आणि माझी शेती बागायती झाली आता मी माझ्या कुटुंबाची गरज भागवून अतिरिक्त उत्पन्न कमावतो. या वाडी परियोजने मुळे खरोखरच मला व माझ्या कुटुंबाला लाभ झाला व त्यामुळे माझा आर्थिक विकास झाला.

# वाडी से मिल रही किसान को स्थायी आय

मै रामलाल पिता बुदेसिंग उइके ग्राम बडगांव का रहने वाला हु मै गौंड आदीवासी समुदाय से हु। मेरे परिवार में तीन सदस्य है। पहले मेरी आर्थिक स्थिति उतनी अच्छी नही थी, कि मै अपने घर का गुजर बसर कर सकूं। इसलिए मुझे मजदूरी करने बाहर जाना

पडता था। कम जमीन होने के कारण मै खेती में उत्पादन भी नहीं कर पा रहा था।

एक दिन नागेश्वरा चेरिटेबल ट्रस्ट के कार्यकता हमारे गांव आए। और नाबार्ड की वाडी परियोजना के विषय में मीटिंग ली उस मीटिंग मे मैने भी भाग लिया तथा उसके फायदे के बारे में बताया तो मुझे लगा की परियोजना से जुड़ना चाहिए और उसका लाभ लेना चाहिए। फिर मैने संस्था के कार्यकताओं के कहे अनुसार 41 इंच 41 इंच 41 इंच के गड्डे बनाना शुरु किया जब मैने 1 गड्डा बनाया तो मुझे बहुत डर लगने लगा तथा मुझे लगा कि मै 60 गड्डे बना पाउंगा. क्या? लेकिन संस्था के कार्यकताओं के मार्गदशन और प्रोत्साहन देने से मुझे लगा कि यह कार्य हो सकता है। फिर इस कार्य को मै और मेरे परिवार



ने उत्साह पुर्वक 41 इंच 41 इंच 41 इंच के पूरे 60 गड्डे मै और मेरी पत्नि ने कडी मेहनत करके पूरा किया तब मेरे मन मे ऐसा विश्वास आने लगा कि मै वाडी को अच्छी तरीके से मेहनत करने से आने वाले दिनों में अच्छा फल मिल सकता है।

फिर मैने कार्यकर्ताओं के बताए अनुसार गोबर की सडी हुई खाद को मिट्टी में मिलाकर गड्डा भरा तथा उसके बाद कार्यकर्ताओं द्वारा दिए गये पौध रोपण प्रशिक्षण में भाग लिया। उसके पश्चात मैने अच्छी बारिश होने पर पौधों को गड्डों में लगाया तथा समय समय पर कार्यकर्ताओं के बताऐ अनुसार खाद लगाया तथा दवा का स्प्रे किया उसके बाद कार्यकर्ताओं के बताऐ अनुसार अमृतपानी का उपचार



हर पाच दिन के अंतराल में करता हूँ। जिससे मेरी वाडी तीव्र गित से बढ़ने लगी है। और मुझे लगने लगा कि आने वाले दिनों में मेरी अच्छी आमदनी इन पौधों से हो सकती है! इसके साथ साथ मैने अपनी जमीन को सुधारने का काम शुरु किया तथा जमीन में पड़े हुय पत्थरों का उपयोग वंड बनाने में किया जिससे मेरी जमीन का कटाव भी रुक रहा है और जमीन खेती करने योग्य बन गयी है! मैं अपनी जमीन में अब 20 से 30 हजार की फसल ले रहा हूं तथा जमीन के निचले हिस्से में सब्जी भाजी उगाने का कार्य भी कर रहा हु जिससे मुझे 5 से 10 हजार की आमदानी मिल रही है!

वाडी मे अच्छी तरह से कार्य करने के लिए गांव मे ग्राम नियोजन समिती का गठन किया गया है जिसके माध्यम से बैठक मे चर्चा कर

हम अपनी समस्या का निदान पाते है तथा समितीकी बैठक में संस्था के कार्यकर्ताओं द्वारा बताए अनुसार वाडी की देख रेख करते है। वैसे तो परियोजना के माध्यम से पौधो मे पानी देने के लिए मुझे एक 200 लीटर का ड्रम दिया गया है और ग्राम नियोजन समिती मे एक बैल गाडी दी गई है जिसमे मै ड्रम रखकर अपनी वाडी मे पानी लाता हु। और मै अब सब्जी भाजी उगाकर अच्छी आय अर्जित कर रहा हुं और मुझे लगता है कि अब वाडी के माध्यम से लखपती बनने के वो दिन दुर नहीं है मै बहुत ही कम समय मे वाडी परियोजना के माध्यम से और मेरे कठिन परिश्रम से लखपती बन जाऊंगा। मैने पपीते की खेती भी किया जिससे मुझे 10000 से 20000 रू की आय प्राप्त होने की संभावना है।

यहां मेरा बहुत अच्छा मन लग रहा है। अब मैने यहीं घर बना लिया हूँ। और वाडी में ही रहता हूँ। ताकि वाडी के माध्यम से मेरी एक सुनिश्चित आय बन सके। मेरे दो बेटों की पढाई करवा रहा हूँ। मै नागेश्वरा चैरिटेबल ट्रस्ट और नाबार्ड को धन्यवाद देता हूँ की मुझे और मेरे जैसे हजारों किसानों को आस–पास के गाँव में वाडी परियोजना से लाभान्वित किया।

# उडान उन्नित की और

में यशोदा बाई पति श्री परसराम पन्द्राम उम्र 34 बर्ष ग्राम खिरैटी तहसील तामिया जिला छिन्दवाडा की निवासी हू। मेरे परिवार में मेरे पति व तीन लडकी है। मेरा सपना था कि मैं जिस परिवार में शादी होकर जाउ उस परिवार व अपने पति की आर्थिक आवक में कुछ

योगदान दे सकू जिससे मेरे परिवार और अपनी पित की नजर में अपना एक स्थान निश्चित कर सकु। लेकिन शादी के बाद मुझे पता चला कि जो स्थिति मेरे मायके की थी और मेरे ससुराल की स्थिति में कोई अन्तर नही था। मेरे पित ही अकेले घर के एकमात्र कमाने वाले थे जिनके उपर अपने परिवार की पूरी जिम्मेदारी थी। मेरे परिवार की स्थिति और गम्भीर हो गई जब मेरे पित का स्वास्थ्य अचानक गभीर बिमारी से ग्रस्त होकर बिस्तर पर पड गये इससे मेरे परिवार की आर्थिक स्थिति और खराब हो गई। घर मे इतने बडे परिवार का खर्च चलाना बडी मुश्किल हो गया। हमारे पास आजीविका का साधन केवल मजदुरी व बटाई से खेती करने के अलावा और कोई विकल्प नही था। ऐसी स्थिति में मै जीवन के प्रति



निराश हो चुकी थी और मेरे चारो तरफ निराशा ही निराशा थी। अब मुझे एक दृढ संकल्पित होकर अपने आत्मविश्वास का बटोरना था। मुझे अपने आप को साबित और सपने को साकार करना था।

अब मुझे मेरी राह तह करनी थी और मुझे मेरी मंजिल मे पहुँचना था। इसी दौरान सन 2012 मे हमारे ग्राम मे नागेश्वरा चेरीटेबल ट्रस्ट के माध्यम से बाडी परियोजना का प्रारंभ हुआ जिसमे भूमिहीनों को भी आर्थिक मदद देकर उनका आजीविका का साधन सुदृढ़ करना था। मुझे यह जानकारी ग्राम नियोजन समिति के माध्यम से प्राप्त हुई। उसके बाद मैने तत्काल वहाँ के समन्यवक व कार्यकर्ता से सम्पर्क कर इस योजना के सम्बन्ध मे जानकारी प्राप्त कर समझ बनाई। मेने अपने परिवार व पित से सलाह कर इस योजना से जुडी जिसके फलस्वरूप मुझे जलपान गृह के लिये आर्थिक मदत जो कि (राशि 12000/-) दी गई। ग्राम मे जलपान गृह खुल जाने से ग्राम वासियो एवं अन्य राहगीरों को सेवा मिलने लगी और मेरी दुकान अच्छी चलने लगी। साथ–साथ मैने अपनी दुकान मे किराना का सामान भी रखने लगी। मुझे अच्छी आमदानी होने लगी। इस तरह मेरे परिवार की आर्थिक स्थिति सुधरने लगी और हमने अपने छोटे देवर की भी शादी कर दी। अब देवर भी मेरे कार्य मे हाथ बटाता है। उसे भी मैने स्वरोजगार से जोड दिया व समाज मे अच्छा स्थान बना लिया।

परियोजना द्वारा दी उस आर्थिक मदद से मेरे जीवन की निराशा को आशा मे बदल दिया। आज मेरे पति और मेरा परिवार मे मेरा बहुत सम्मान है। यदि परियोजना मेरी सही वक्त मे मदद नहीं करती तो यह सब सम्भव नहीं हो पाता।

# भुमिहीन महिला शेळी पालन करून मुलांना देत आहे उच्च शिक्षण

माझे नाव श्रीमती आनंदाबाई विनोद कडयाम आहे. मी साधुटोला या गावी राहते. मी भूमिहीन आहे. मला एक मुलगा व एक मुलगी आहे. दोघेही षाळेत जातात आम्ही तिघेही लोक कुटुंबात आहोत. मी मोलमजूरी करून आपल्या कुटुंबाचा उदरनिर्वाह करीत असते.

आमच्या गावामध्ये नागेश्वरा चॅरिटेबल ट्रस्ट एन.सी.टी. च्या अंतर्गत देण्यात येणाऱ्या वाडी प्रकल्पा मधील वाडीधारक आहेत. त्यांचेकडे नागेश्वरा चॅरिटेबल ट्रस्ट कुरखेडा येथील कार्यकर्ते येत असतात. मधून-मधुन मिटींग सुध्दा होते. असेच मिटींग मध्ये सांगण्यात येणाच्या योजनेबाबत काही महिलांनी मला मिळण्यात येणाऱ्या योजनेबाबत थोडक्यात सांगितले. मी तशीही योजनांच्या शोधात होती. एका कार्यकर्त्याला शेवटी मी मला एखादी काही तुमच्या कार्यालयातुन मदत मिळेल काय?'' म्हणुन विचारले. त्यावर त्यांनी मला शेळी पालन, दुग्ध व्यवसाय, लघु उद्योग इ. बाबत माहिती सांगितली. मी मोलमजूरी करून उदरनिर्वाह झाला पाहिजे म्हणून शेळी पालन हा व्यवसाय निवडला. त्याला लागणारे सारे कागदपत्रा विषयी सविस्तर माहिती गोळा केली व कागदपत्र जमविले.



काही दिवसात लवकरच कागदपत्र व लाभार्थी अंशदान ३००० रूपये कार्यकर्त्यांकडे जमा केले. ते पैसे बँकेत भरून पावती कार्यालयातुन जमा केली. ती पावती मुख्य कार्यालयाला पाठविली. तिकडून मंजूरी आल्यावर लवकरच मला त्यांनी १०००० दहा हजार रूपये मंजूर झाल्याचे सांगितले ते १०००० रूपये व ३००० रूपये असे एकुण १३००० रूपयाचे ४ चार बकरी मला त्यांनी घेऊन दिल्या.

मी मजुरीकाम पण करायची व शेळी पाळायची आज माझ्याकडे ४ शेळीचे ऐवजी ८ शेळया झालेल्या आहेत. त्यापैकी एक शेळी मी माझ्या मुलाचे शिक्षण आजार व इतर घरगुती कामासाठी वापरण्यात आले. मला वेळेवर पैशाचे काम पडले त्यावेळी दुसऱ्या कुणाला मदत मागण्यापेक्षा आज मी माझ्या घरपोच पैसे (शेळीचे) कामात आणले व माझी अडचण दूर केली मला याचेच खुप समाधान वाटले.मला खुप आधार असल्यासारखा वाटला. मी मनोमन समाधानी आली. कारण मला आर्थिक मदत मिळाली मी नागेश्वरा चॅरिटेबल ट्रस्ट संस्थेचे व माझ्यापर्यंत मदत पोहचविणाऱ्या कार्यकर्त्यांचे खुप आभार मानते.




